This notice of intent to begin a Home Education Program is sent within thirty days of beginning this Home Education Program, in compliance with Florida Statute 1002.41(1)(a). In accordance with Florida law, a portfolio with a log of educational activities kept contemporaneously with instruction, titles of reading materials, and samples of materials used or generated by the student will be kept. An evaluation will be done and documentation submitted to the school district each year by the anniversary of this letter annually and/or within 30 days of terminating our home education program in accordance with Florida law and in accordance with Florida Department of Education policies as stated in their Home Education FAQ.
