Use the Field Trips & Special Events Log to capture outings, performances, workshops, or co-op activities. Document the purpose, what was learned, and your child's reflections.

5. Document Extracurricular Activities

Use this log to highlight sports, music, art, clubs, or hobbies. Include what the student did, the frequency, and how they grew from the experience.

6. Use Assessment Tracking by Level
